

Total Faculty—Appointment Type

There are 5,633 faculty teaching in NAAB-accredited degree programs. This number includes adjuncts. This total represents a 10% decrease from 2012–2013, when the total number of faculty was 6,231.

Of this total, 2,313 (42%) are full-time, 458 (9%) are part-time, and 2,862 (49%) are adjunct faculty. The percentage of full-time faculty remains unchanged from 2012–2013. The large increase in the percentage of adjuncts—from 39% in 2012–2013 to 49% in 2013–2014—may reflect the NAAB's elimination of the "instructor" category from its data collection and a more accurate report of the number of adjuncts.

OVERALL FACULTY




Faculty—Gender

The gender breakdown of full- and part-time faculty (excludes adjuncts) is 1,956 (71%) male and 815 (29%) female. This breakdown is roughly the same as it was in 2012–2013 (70/30).

The percentages by rank for the 2013–2014 academic year are as follows:

- Full professors: 714 (77%) male and 219 (23%) female (79/21 in 2012–2013)
- Associate professors: 673 (71%) male and 269 (29%) female (72/28 in 2012–2013)
- Assistant professors: 569 (64%) male and 327 (36%) female (66/34 in 2012–2013)


OVERALL FACULTY BY GENDER



Faculty—Rank

Of the 5,633 total faculty, 933 (16%) are full professors, 942 (17%) are associate professors, 896 (16%) are assistant professors, and 2,862 (51%) are adjuncts. The percentage distribution is nearly identical to that of 2012–2013, except for assistant professors, which decreased by 25%.

FACULTY BY RANK




Faculty—Ethnicity

There were 2,061 (74%) faculty members (excludes adjuncts) who indicated White with respect to ethnicity. The remaining indicated the following: 9 (0%) American Indian or Alaskan Native; 197 (7%) Asian; 3 (0%) Native Hawaiian or other Pacific Islander; 101 (4%) Black or African American; 191 (7%) Hispanic/Latino; 85 (3%) two or more races; 50 (2%) nonresident alien; and 74 (3%) race and ethnicity unknown. This distribution is identical to that of 2012–2013.

Following is the ethnicity distribution by rank for 2013–2014 (2012–2013 distribution is in parentheses):

- Full professors: 80% White/20% all other categories (82/18)
- Associate professors: 77/23 (79/21)
- Assistant professors: 65/35 (72/28)
- Adjuncts: 69/31 (71/29 in 2012)


OVERALL FACULTY BY ETHNICITY



Credentials for Full, Associate, and Assistant Professors

Based on data supplied by accredited architecture programs for the 2013–2014 academic year, 2,771 individuals are employed as full-time instructional faculty at the full, associate, or assistant professor level.

Of that number, 1,584 (57%) have an accredited M. Arch. degree, and 1,093 (39%) are registered to practice in a U.S. jurisdiction.



Faculty Salaries—National Averages

As expected, the salary range for full professor exceeded that of associate professor, which, in turn, exceeded that of assistant professor.

The average salary for full professors nationwide increased by 14% from the 2012–2013 average. Associate professors saw a 5% increase in average salaries, and assistant professors a 1% increase. The average salary for instructors decreased by 19% from 2012–2013.

Comparing Public and Private Institutions

Generally, national averages for salaries at public institutions are higher than at private institutions. However, this year, the average salary for professors at private institutions (\$114,062) was higher than the average salary at public institutions (\$96,233).

Averages by ACSA Region

The highest regional average for full professor is in the Mid-Atlantic region at \$150,333. The highest average for associate professor is in the West Central region at \$79,845. The highest average for assistant professor is in the West Central region at \$66,136. The highest regional average for instructor is in the East Central region at \$32,397.
